- Wilderness is for travel by foot and stock only. Motorized and mechanized equipment is prohibited, including: motorbikes, bicycles, strollers, chainsaws, carts, hand gliders, rock drills, aircraft and other non-primitive tools and modes of transportation. 36CFR261.18a
- Travel on established trails as much as possible to reduce impacts. Cutting switchbacks causes erosion and trail damage. Protect trails by not cutting switchbacks. 36CFR261.55e
- Do not graze, tether, highline, hitch or picket stock within 200 feet (approximately 74 adult steps) of water or trail, except for loading and unloading. 36CFR261.58aa
- Storing or caching equipment or supplies for more than 48 hours is prohibited. Geocaches are prohibited in wilderness. 36CFR261.57f
- Do not fire any weapon capable of injuring others within 150 yards of trails, occupied areas or across water, 36CFR261.10d
- Certified weed free feed is required for all stock animals while recreating on public land. Help prevent the spread of invasive weed species in the backcountry. 36CFR261.58t

SITE SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

Designated Campsites: camping is prohibited within the general area except within 15 feet slope distance of a post or sign designating an approved campsite within the following areas: North Matthieu Lake, South Matthieu Lake, Green Lakes, Moraine Lake, Otter Lake, Erma Bell Lakes, Jefferson Park Area, Duffy Lake, Pamelia Lake Area, Wasco Lake and Square Lake. 36CFR261.58e

Fire Ban: Building, attending, maintaining a campfire or stove burning solid fuels in the following areas: Obsidian Falls Area, South Matthieu Lake, Golden Lake, Husband/Eileen Lakes, Chambers Lakes Area, Green Lakes, Moraine Lakes, Sisters Mirror Lakes, Table Lake, Rockpile Lake, Jefferson Park Area, Marion Lake, Ann Lake and Pamelia Lake Area. 36CFR261.52a

Dog Leash Law: Dogs must be on leash while traveling on the following trails: Broken Top Trail (#10), Crater Ditch Trail, Todd Lake Trail (#34), Soda Creek Trail (#11), Green Lakes Trail (#17), Moraine Lake Trail (#17.1) and South Sister Climbers Trail (#36). 36CFR261.58s

Wilderness Self-Issue Permit

YOU ARE ENTERING CONGRESSIONALLY DESIGNATED WILDERNESS. HELP PROTECT YOUR WILDERNESS BY KNOWING AND FOLLOWING THESE STEWARDSHIP PRINCIPLES:

- All groups and/or individuals must have a completed wilderness permit for all day and/or overnight trips. 36CFR261.57a
- Group size is limited to 12 people and 12 stock. Protect the wilderness landscape and other visitors' experiences by keeping your group size to 12 people and 12 stock. If you have more than 12 people or 12 stock in your group, you must adjust your group's size to a group of 12 or less. The remaining members of the oversized group must use a different trail head and follow a completely separate trip itinerary from your own ensuring that your groups will not travel together or stay/use a common destination for the duration of your trip. 36CFR261.58a
- Campfires are not allowed within 100 feet (approximately 37 adult steps) of any
 water or trail. Campfires increase campsite size, can result in wildfires and negatively
 impact riparian areas. When fires are needed, please use existing fire rings, gather
 only dead and downed wood that is wrist sized or smaller. Be aware of special fire
 ban areas noted below, 36CFR261.52a
- Pack out all garbage including food waste. Do not burn or bury any garbage, food waste or food wrappers. 36CFR261.11b
- Do not cut trees, snags or boughs. Please use dead and down wood that is wrist sized or smaller if you need a campfire. <u>36CFR261.6a</u>
- Bury human and pet waste at least 200 feet (approximately 74 adult steps) from all
 water and trails into an 8–12 inch deep cat hole. Make sure to strain waste water into
 an 8–12 inch deep cat hole. 36CFR261.57g
- When you arrive at your destination, use existing campsites rather than making a new site. Look for campsites that are at least 100 feet (approximately 37 adult steps) from water or trail. Do not walk or camp in areas closed for restoration. These areas have been replanted to restore natural conditions. 36CFR261.58e

All of the regulations listed on the visitor copy are 36CFR261 federal laws enforceable by fine and or time in jail. For actual Code of Federal Regulation language please visit any wilderness trail head, National Forest Ranger Station or National Forest Website.
